Tourism Commissioner Meeting Report - August 2023

- 1. Morehead State University Group Visit to Berea Craft Festival:
 - A group (30) from Morehead State University visited the Berea Craft Festival, enhancing our local arts and crafts tourism.
 - The event was successful, providing an opportunity for visitors to experience the rich cultural heritage of Berea.
- 2. Upcoming Grassroots Motorsports Group Visit in October:
 - Wave 1 and Wave 2 of the Grassroots Motorsports group are scheduled to visit Berea in October.
 - The group consists of 30 couples, totaling 60 people per wave, and we are expecting around 120 meals to be served during their stay.
 - The first wave of reservations is already sold out, indicating strong interest and potential economic benefits for the city.
 - The approximate cost per person for the tour is \$4,000.
- 3. Collaboration with Collette to Enhance Itineraries in Berea:
 - Productive discussions with Collette have taken place to expand their usual itineraries in Berea for their tour groups.
 - The new itinerary aims to provide a more comprehensive and engaging experience of Berea's attractions to their visitors.

4. Partnership with Berea Community School's Special Needs Program:

- A partnership has been established with Berea Community School's special needs program.
- Starting from August 21st, a student will work with the Tourism Office in the Welcome Center for one hour each week.
- The collaboration aims to foster essential skills such as people skills, professional skills, and social skills for the student.
