- a) Welcome to Donna Brewer as new restaurant commissioner, replacing Aaron Crawford
- b) ARPA Funds will be finished by December and has been used to shoot new photos, a 30-minute tv show (Crossroads), New group tour planner distribution materials, Motorcoach digital and print ads, motorcoach conferences. The remainder of the funding will be used in 2024 for a series of four photoshoots covering all the city's assets in each season, a summer podcast through iheartradio, a new magazine called Travel Berea, new rack cards, a new bike trail map, and KY Visitor's guide ad.

The agreement was made that a total of \$400,000 would be acceptable to replace signage and complete needed repairs and maintenance for the year
